BURSARY OPPORTUNITIES FOR 2023 ACADEMIC YEAR

The Gauteng Gambling Board (GGB) is a Schedule 3C Public Entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act 1 of 1999). The GGB has been established in terms of section 3 of the Gauteng Gambling Act, 1995 as amended ("the Act")

The GGB invites unemployed youth (not older than 25 years) who are suitable to study at the registered South African higher learning institutions towards their first undergraduate degree, diploma or certificate in the following fields of study;

- Computer Science & Information Technology studies - (Computer Engineering, Computer Sciences, Graphic Design & Game Graphics, Informatics & Information Systems, Information Technology, Information and Communications Technology, Multimedia & Interactive Media, Software Engineering & Software Development)
- Accounting studies - (Auditing, Chartered Accounting, Financial Accounting, Finance & Financial Management, General Accounting)
- Legal studies
- Tourism and Hospitality studies
- Security management studies
- Horse Racing / Jockey apprenticeship training program

Applicants should meet the following minimum requirements to be considered;

- Be a South African citizen and a resident of Gauteng
- Have Grade 12/NCV Certificate at NQF level
- For the Jockey apprenticeship qualification, applicants must have complied with the Training academy's entrance requirements
- Provide proof of acceptance from registered South African higher learning institution
- Provide their last academic record and achieve good results with an average of 65%
- Intend on studying full time

- Download and complete the GGB application form from www.ggb.org.za
- Submit clear copies of the following supporting documentation along with your application form (the submission of these documents is compulsory, if any items are missing your application will not be considered)
- ID document (certified copy)
- Matric certificate or recent academic record (certified copy)
- Proof of registration and course fees
- Motivational letter explaining why you deserve to be awarded a bursary and your need for funding
- The financial checks affidavit form must be signed by your parent(s) or guardian(s) and you, the bursary applicant. Please download the financial checks affidavit form from www.ggb.org.za
- Applicants whose parents are Military veterans must submit a copy of confirmation with Force number from the Department of Military Veterans
